Previously, Cathy led Halliburton's global marketing strategy and execution. In 2011, Cathy was named as one of the 'Women Worth Watching' by the Profiles in Diversity Journal and has received many other awards.

Cathy is a registered descendant member of the Daughters of the American Revolution and serves on the Girl Scouts of San Jacinto Council. Cathy and her husband, Stan, reside in Kingwood.

Albert is part of the Association's leadership team and spoke to us about all the functions that student ambassadors do to help The Association. They provide campus tours, meet Ags coming in for Ring Day or for game day, and speak to groups like our Aggie Moms. Albert was a great speaker, and he talked fondly about meeting older Ags who graduated in the 1960's, and their gusto, zeal and love for the University. Here is a bit more about the Association of Former Students. Congrats to all the Ags getting their rings on April 8. We have several students receiving them; my son is one of them and I could not be prouder!

The Association of Former Students traces its history to the Ex-Cadets Association that formed in 1879, and later to the A&M Alumni Association and Alpha Phi Fraternity. In 1919, a coalition of multiple alumni groups formed under the name The Association of Former Students. Since 1879, much has changed in organization and details, but the fundamental objectives of The Association remain the same: strengthening the Aggie Network, promoting Texas A&M, perpetuating the ties of affection formed in university days, and serving the student body. In May 1921, The Association published the first issue of *Texas Aggie* magazine.

In the years since, The Association's communications have evolved to include newsletters, a website, and now multiple social media channels, but *Texas Aggie* magazine remains the flagship publication of the Aggie Network. In 1987, The Association erected its first free-standing building, the Clayton W. Williams, Jr. Alumni Center, which today remains a campus landmark. Today the former students of Texas A&M remain proud of our past yet committed to the future. Our methods and programs have evolved tremendously over the years, but the noble cause of the Ex-Cadets Association is still carried out by the staff and dedicated volunteers of The Association of Former Students.

#### Activities – Parents' Weekend 2016 (April 8<sup>th</sup> – 10<sup>th</sup>)

Parents' Weekend is a tradition that has existed at Texas A&M University since 1919. Texas A&M University prides itself on making its visitors feel welcome. The University has given parents and guests a special time to feel this warm greeting. Parents' Weekend has become the official "HOWDY"!

The History....In the early 1900s when membership in the Corps of Cadets was mandatory, mothers often found themselves worrying about the welfare of their sons. A federation known as the Aggie Mother's Club was formed by these mothers whose main goal was to help their sons through their difficult "fish" and underclassman years. A program similar to open house was held on Mother's Day. However, in 1969 graduation was changed to early May and the program was moved to April.



This cherished A&M tradition has been previously designated Mother's Day, Mother and Dad's Day, Parent Appreciation, and Open House. Presently, it is called Parents' Weekend. Until 1974, an Aggie Mother of the Year was selected. Recently, the students began selecting an outstanding couple to honor as the Aggie Parents of the Year.

Corps flower pinning, chapel services, military reviews,

Parents of the Year receptions, campus tours and outfit award presentations have been part of the weekend since its beginning. New activities are continually being added to include a wider variety of students. Some of these new activities include a traditions program, concerts, Bevo Burn Barbecue, Maroon and White Football Game, All University Awards, and 'Ol Army Yell Practice.

Student Government sponsors the student committee which organizes every aspect of Parents' Weekend. This special time is dedicated to Aggie parents and family, and gives Aggie students a chance to express their gratitude to those who have impacted their lives.
